Specific Qualifications:

Plan 1.1 Academic

- 1) Applicants must have completed a Bachelor's degree or its equivalent in Engineering (Energy, Mechanical, Electrical, Technology, or Innovation) from an institution accredited by the Office of the Civil Service Commission (OCSC), with a cumulative grade point average (GPAX) of no less than 3.00; or
- 2) Applicants who have completed the requirements in item 1, but have a cumulative grade point average (GPAX) of no less than 2.75, must have at least one research publication presented at a national academic conference;
- 3) Applicants must meet the qualifications as specified in the Maejo University regulations on graduate studies;
 - 4) Other cases shall be at the discretion of the student selection committee.

Plan 1.2 Academic

- 1) Applicants must hold a Bachelor's degree or its equivalent in Engineering (B.Eng.), Science (B.Sc.), Industrial Education (B.Ind.Ed.), Industrial Technology (B.Ind.Tech.), or Technology (B.Tech.) in fields related to energy, mechanical, electrical, technology, or innovation; or possess an equivalent degree and field as deemed appropriate by the Head of the Master of Engineering Program in Renewable Energy Engineering, from an institution accredited by the Office of the Civil Service Commission (OCSC), with a cumulative grade point average (GPAX) of not less than 2.50; or
- 2) Applicants who have completed the requirements in item 1 but have a cumulative grade point average (GPAX) of less than 2.50 must possess qualifications as deemed appropriate and approved by the Program Head/Program Committee for admission;

- 3) Applicants must fulfill the qualifications as stipulated by the Maejo University Regulations on Graduate Studies, and other related rules and announcements of the University in effect at that time;
 - 4) Other cases shall be at the discretion of the Student Selection Committee.

Plan 2 Professional

1) Applicants must hold a Bachelor's degree or its equivalent in Engineering (B.Eng.), Science (B.Sc.), Industrial Education (B.Ind.Ed.), Industrial Technology (B.Ind.Tech.), or Technology (B.Tech.) in fields related to energy, mechanical, electrical, technology, or innovation, or other degrees and fields as deemed equivalent and approved by the Head of the Master of Engineering Program in Renewable Energy Engineering. The institution must be accredited by the Office of the Civil Service Commission (OCSC), and applicants must have a cumulative grade point average (GPAX) of not less than 2.50; or

2) Applicants who have completed the requirements in item 1 but have a cumulative grade point average (GPAX) of less than 2.50 must possess qualifications as considered appropriate for admission by the Program Head or faculty members of the program; or

- 3) In case the applicant has not completed a Bachelor's degree as specified in item 1, consideration for admission may be given if the applicant is deemed to have sufficient potential to study in the chosen major, as approved by the Program Head;
- 4) Applicants must fulfill the qualifications as stipulated by the Maejo University Regulations on Graduate Studies;
 - 5) Other cases shall be at the discretion of the Student Selection Committee.

Required Application Documents:

- A digital file of a straight-face photograph, size 1 inch (300 x 400 pixels), without a hat or dark glasses, taken within the last 6 months; graduation gown photos are not permitted (to be uploaded to the application system).
- A recommendation letter, in the format provided by the Admissions and Public Relations Division, duly filled and signed by a supervisor, a former instructor, or an individual who knows the applicant well (excluding family members).
- A copy of the passport (only the first page with personal information).
- A copy of the undergraduate transcript.
- A copy of the document showing name/surname change, or marriage certificate (in case the name/surname does not match other application documents).
- A certificate of student status for those in the final semester of their undergraduate program.
